

Pork Butt End of Year Write-Up

Intro

I tell you what we had a good season this year as franchises start to secure long-term deals and utilize the seasoned veterans to become competitive. The league entered its fourth year and looking healthy heading into its fifth season. But, enough with the looking back, let us focus on the franchises and see how they matched up with their preseason hype.

The Outcomes

1. Jason – at the start of the season I predicted that Jason would finish third overall. His team looked good on paper, and the only downside to his franchise is that treacherous playoff history. This year he proved that he could win playoff games, and even a championship. His team was led by Josh Allen, Bijan Robinson, and Puka. These three scored a lot, scored often, and remained healthy. This was the closest his franchise has come to the title game, but the season was not a wash. His offense was led by JSN, and Trey McBride, players like Henry and Prescott sprinkled solid scoring weeks along the way to the playoffs. 4. Dave- I am not sure where to put my franchise during these write-ups as sometimes I am baffled by the times I win and frustrated by the games I lost that I should have won. I had predicted I would finish the year in sixth place, but I shocked myself by finishing fourth, a franchise best. Second consecutive year making the playoffs lead to massive beatdown in the second round, humbled me, and showed me you can be lucky in the regular season, but you need to have a solid team in the playoffs. Having the most efficient offense (I finished 8-6) but also ranked ninth in total scoring (1670) led to many headscratchers but the formula works to produce a playoff team, now, just must figure out the playoffs.
5. Brandon- The champions of 2024 I had figured this franchise would finish seventh in the year. He did finish sixth in the year, which means the roster that was hot in 2024 cooled off in 2025, making my prediction almost spot on. In my pre-season write up I had him finishing eighth, and I was not far off on my prediction as he finished seventh this year, just missing the playoffs for the second consecutive time in as many years. The roster has talent, (Gibbs, Etienne Jr, Olave) but there is not enough consistency in the roster for desired weekly results. There is a lot of room on the roster for next season, question is can he fill with producing players?

Several players (Deebo, Brown, Thomas Jr) did not perform to their potential which cost him several single digit losses. This year reminded me of his 2023 season (similar roster, same results), but I do believe in history so maybe next year will be a banner year?
